When is the best time for our school to host a Kidz in Lids event?

Many schools hold events during September because it is Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, but anytime throughout the school year is great! You can pick one day or hold your event over a few days or even a week. Just check your school's calendar and pick a time that will really allow the event to be focused on and not interfere with other school activities/events. CCP is here to support you ANYTIME!

Why does CCP want to know if our school's event is being held in memory/honor of someone?

CCP would love to know if you are honoring or memorializing someone with your event. If it is being held in honor of one of the children we are serving we want to be sure the family is aware and notify others who might be interested and want to support your event. If your event is being held in memory/honor of someone who is not connected with CCP we want to be sure we recognize them appropriately in any references to your event.

How do we set a fundraising goal for our event?

Just talk to our CCP staff! We will be happy to work with you to set a realistic goal for your event based on our experience in working with other schools of similar size in your area.

What portion of the funds our school raises through our Kidz in Lids event will go to support the families served by Children's Cancer Partners?

All of the money you raise will be used to help local children who are battling cancer and their families.

What will CCP do with the funds our school raises?

CCP will use the funds raised to help children get to the lifesaving care they need despite the overwhelming cost of gas or flights to get there or the meals and lodging necessary when staying away from home.
